The NEORQC Education Grant is offered to provide from \$100 to \$500 to organizations or guilds teaching the fine art of quilting, raising public awareness and outreach of quilting in the community. We especially encourage projects that introduce youth to sewing and quilting. This money is to be used for supplies for the planned education/teaching of quilting to children, adults, scouts, 4-H, and other community organizations.

We funded five grants for November, 2023 – October, 2024: Sew for Service, Calico Hearts with Girl Scout Troop 90110, Girl Scout Troop 91278, Ohio Star Quilters - Kids Quilt, Tuscarawas County 4-H Quilt Day.

### You can bring a smile to the finder of a Quilted Heart!

Sewing quilted hearts for others to find can be a personal project or perhaps a project for a guild. Note: there is no pattern for the hearts, just make them about the size of the palm of your hand. There is a tag for you to download and print to attach to your heart. Or, at least the words you must use.

<u>How the Project Began – I Found A Quilted Heart</u> "In January, 2014, the most random thing happened while vacationing in Nevada. The Three Sisters and our husbands took a day trip to Valley of Fire State Park. While hiking, we found a heart near a cave in the middle of nowhere. There was nothing to identify the maker or what to do with it, just a tag that said, 'I need a home.'

Would you like to create handmade quilted hearts to participate in this project? IFAQH is all about the finder. The makers of the hearts remain anonymous. Hearts are made of fabric, generally the size of your palm, and can be any shape of heart you choose. Most have a layer of batting or fiberfill and you can embellish with buttons, sequins, ribbon, etc. Have fun with your creative process!"
